I want to thank all the dock holders with their patience in the aftermath of this summer's Nor'easter. We had a lot of damage to our docks. Thanks to Huron Marine Products and PC Mike Fishbaugh for attending to the damage the following week:

1. **A Dock** - bolts all checked/replaced, structural damage checked.
2. **B Dock** - uprights replaced on 30' docks. Balance of uprights checked /tightened.
3. **C Dock** - alignment still needs fixing. Probably 2-3 weeks out or maybe when boats are put away for the winter? Post to checked / replaced or tightened.

Water wall has been removed from the ramp to the bend between B and C docks. Next meeting we will discuss removing the rest of the wood from the water wall.

ISCA Nationals - Bernie Ashyk, Fleet No. 1 Captain. Thank you to all the many very, very, generous SSC members and Interlake Sailing Class Association officers and sailors who volunteered their time to provide the racers and spectators all the best in what SSC has to offer.

The 2021 ISCA National Championships, postponed for a year, showed off our talents in the organization, race and on-shore management, hospitality, dining, refreshments, entertainment, awards procurement and presentation and of course the challenging sailing in Sandusky Bay,

National Regatta Chair SSC Trustee Danny Olson and his resourceful committees began organizing this event in 2019 after Jay Austin's "Proposal to Host" was accepted by the ISCA.

The committees:

- a) secured a cast of regionally known seasoned judges, a USSA sanctioned PRO from Syracuse, New York to provide fair racing;
- b) recruited an all-star cast of SSC Race Committee members, mark boats, safety boats, on-shore support;
- c) worked with the ISCA to provide a sail measuring / weighing crew, found a willing and very able galley staff to provide breakfasts, lunches, and great dinners, and a bar staff to quench our thirst. And of course we were grateful to have the full support of the SSC Bridge and Board.

Starting on Wednesday, July 14 the Women's and Junior's Championships were sailed with our own Chris Malott and crew Denny Butts taking the honors.

Thursday morning saw 34 boats start in the combined Championship/Challenger Divisions. Three races in the Main Bay south of Johnson's Island in 18-22 mph winds from the SW were challenging to the three-person boats, and quite a handful for the two-person crews.

Friday's four races were in the East Bay with more manageable winds and tight competition.

On Saturday morning racing was delayed to wait for the wind to subside and the parking lot to be pumped out. The scheduled one race was abandoned and the Regatta was concluded.

A delicious lunch was served followed by a great awards presentation by Danny Olson and Jim Ward.
