in July. All sailors this year have been excited to use the new Opti's and Zests. They have proven to be very stable boats and provide adequate sailing experiences for new and experienced sailors.

The Zests have been a game changer for YLTS instruction and can be sailed by 1-3 sailors. They were put to the capsizing test by a very proficient SJRT sailor and it was extremely difficult for that sailor to capsize the Zest in 15-20 knots of breeze. At that point we were convinced these were the best addition we could have made to our program.

We are currently implementing a longterm plan for the Dry Sail Area that maximizes use of the limited area that we have. Please understand that we may ask you to move your boat to another spot to accomplish the goal of improving accessibility for all and making better use of the space our club does have. We have a large number of new Interlake sailors this year and a newly organized Laser Fleet that is racing every Friday evening. Thank you for your understanding in advance. We have fixed the uprights on Springer's Wharf and are moving on to Dock A for tightening/repairing or replacing the uprights as necessary.

Hoist problems - Just as soon as we fixed the mast hoist the J/24 hoist controller was found to be full of water. That is now fixed as well and is operational.

Electric - Stivley Electrical is finishing up repairs to our dock electrical systems.

Disconnects are being installed on all hoists. Before using a hoist, be sure you know where the disconnect is in case of an emergency. We had one hoist malfunction and did not turn off when the controller was released. Turning off the disconnect will disable the hoist. Please do not turn off hoists at the breakers unless absolutely necessary.

New lights are being installed on Springer's Wharf. Solar charged lights have been installed on uprights around the basin to show where the water meets the land.

Flexible conduit - In the near future, we'll be addressing the floating dock flexible conduit runs that are in the water.

SSC to welcome first peace vessel

The **Golden Rule**, the first peace vessel of the modern era, will be visiting Sandusky on Aug. 8, 9 and 10. She'll berth at the Paper District Marina. A number of sailing club members have supported the project including Peter Huston, Harrison Pratt, Tom Cassidy, Bill Good and PC Skip Oliver. The boat will be available for tours, interviews, and sailing on the Bay Aug. 9, weather permitting.

The 37-foot wooden ketch was built in 1958 in San Pedro, CA and gained fame in the 1950s as four Quakers sailed her out toward the Marshall Islands in an effort to halt



atmospheric testing of nuclear weapons. After a long hiatus as a private vessel, she sank in a storm in Humboldt Bay, CA, in 2010. Veterans For Peace raised her from the depths for a rebuild that was completed in 2015. Now she sails for peace once more, currently on the Great Loop around the Eastern US. The vessel is now in New England and SSC's own "B-Dock Bill" Good is the First Mate.

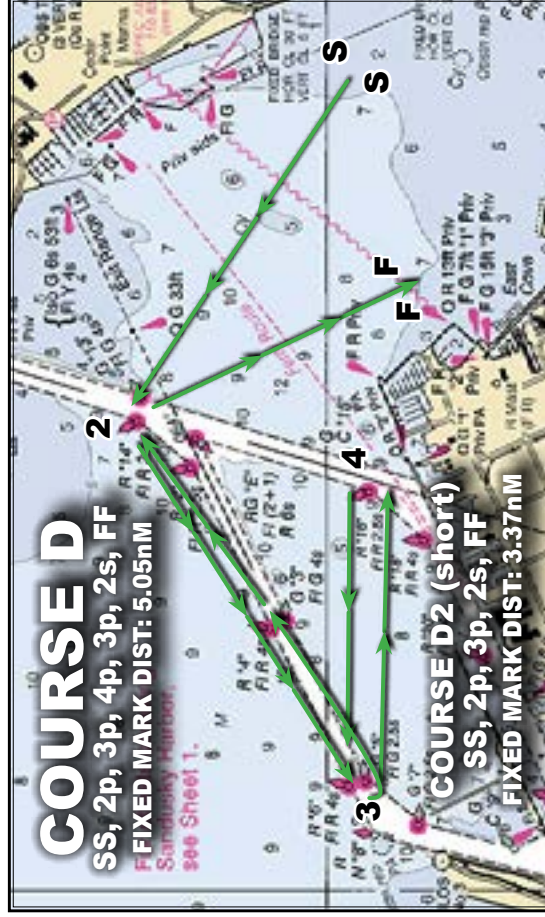
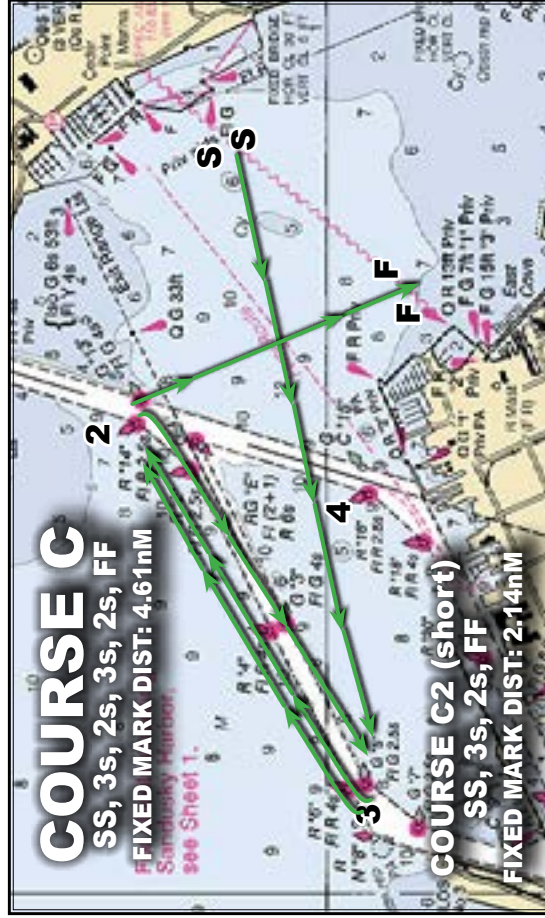
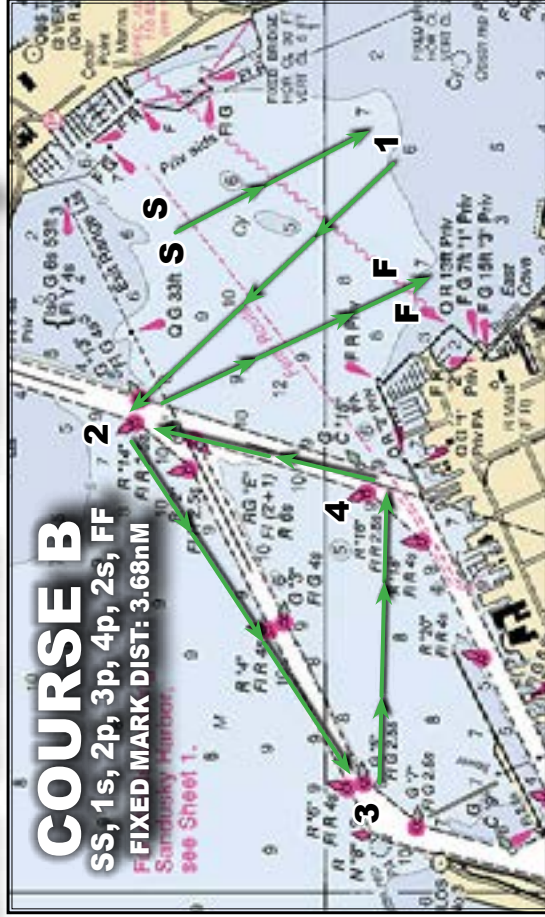

SSC Auxiliary Fleet Sailing Instructions 2023 Wednesday Night Series

1 RULES

- 1.1 The races/series will be governed by the rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing for 2021-2024. (RRS)
- 1.2 The PHRF-LE Code of Regulations will apply.
- 1.3 The T-10 Class One Design Rules will apply.
- 1.4 These Sailing Instructions (SI's) will apply.
- 1.5 Race dates, warning times and start order are specified in the 2023 SSC Race Schedule.
- 1.6 The Wednesday Evening Race Courses – Auxiliary 2023 edition will apply.
- 1.7 The NOR issued by each fleet will apply.

2 NOTICES TO COMPETITORS & CHANGES TO THE SI'S

Notices to competitors and changes to these SI's will be posted on the Race Notice bulletin board located on the east wall of the SSC Clubhouse. Any change to these SI's will be posted no later than 2 hours prior to the first class start.

3 SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 3.1 Signals made ashore shall be displayed from the flag stand on ESCORT 1
- 3.2 When flag AP is displayed ashore, '1 minute' is replaced with 'not less than 30 minutes' in the race signal AP.

4 CLASS FLAGS

JAM A / B Purple
PHRF / T-10 Green with yellow diagonal

5 MARKS

The starting mark will be an orange inflatable.
Mark 1 will be an orange inflatable
Mark 2 will be the R"14" channel buoy.
Mark 3 will be G"5" channel buoy.
Mark 4 will be R"16" channel buoy.

6 PENALTY SYSTEM

RRS 44.1 is changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty.

7 THE START

The starting line will be between a nearby orange inflatable mark and the staff on the signal boat holding an orange flag.

8 THE FINISH

The finish line will be between an inflatable mark and the SSC entry buoy.

9 TIME LIMITS

- 9.1 If no boat has passed the first fixed mark within 1 hour of their start, the race will be abandoned for all classes.
- 9.2 If the first boat within each fleet has not finished within two hours of their start, the race will be abandoned for that fleet.

10 PROTESTS AND REQUESTS FOR REDRESS

Protest forms are available in the Commodore's Room. Protests and requests for redress shall be delivered to the Commodore's Room within 1 hour after the RC boat docks.

11 SCORING

RRS A4 low point scoring system shall apply.

12 SAFETY REGULATIONS

- 12.1 When Code Flag "L" is displayed, all boats racing are required to sail past the transom of the RC signal boat and supply their boat name, sail numbers and class to be raced.
- 12.2 A boat that retires from the race shall notify the race committee as soon as possible.

13 RADIO COMMUNICATION

13.1 Except in an emergency, a boat shall neither make wireless transmissions while racing nor receive wireless communications not freely available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones.

13.2 Except for emergencies, communications with the race committee shall not be initiated during any starting sequence.

13.3 SSC RC boats use VHF channels 68 and/or 72 for race communications.

13.4 Race committee boats will monitor channel 16, as required by FCC rules, whenever not actively communicating on another channel.

14 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors participate in the series entirely at their own risk. See RRS Rule 3 "Decision to Race". The Sandusky Sailing Club will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the races within this series.

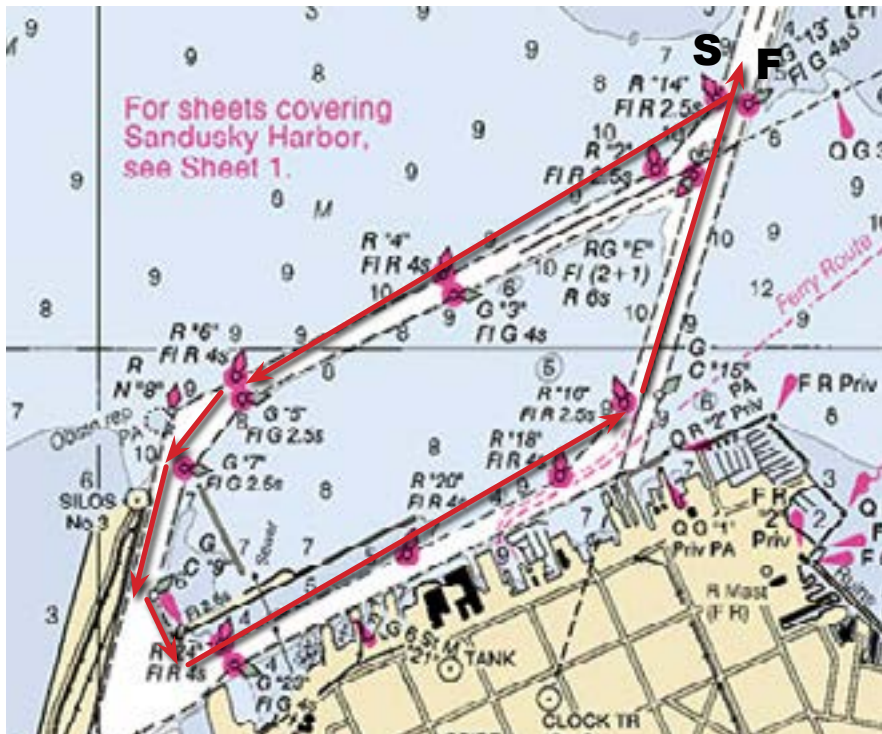

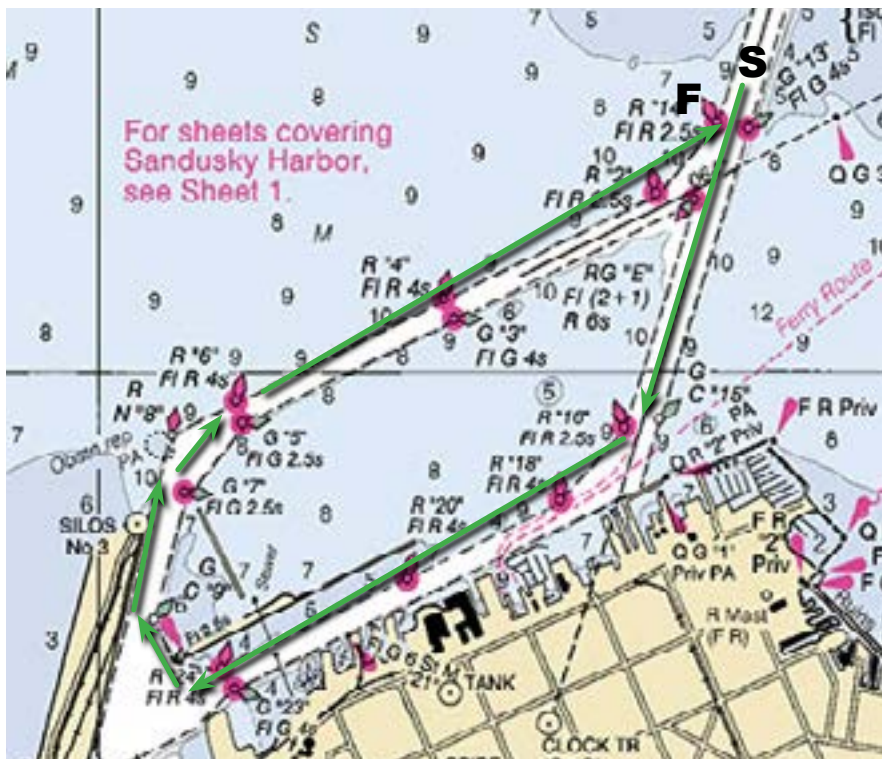
